





About Sindhi Mandir

Holy Mission of Guru Nanak (London), popularly known as "Sindhi Mandir" and Sindhi Community House, is part of the Mission established by Dada Ishwar Balani in 1971 that aims to meet the **twin principles of Shewa (service to humanity) and Bhakti (devotion to God)**. Today, the Mission has centres in Kolkata, Pune, Khandala and London. The London centre has operated from it's base in Cricklewood since 1997. In keeping with core principles, the London centre promotes Hinduism and Sindhi Culture through organisation of prayer meetings, lectures, public celebration of religious festivals, and distributes information.



We also work to promote good mental and physical health, community inclusivity, and the relief of poverty and hardship. All are welcome, regardless of their background. The range of activities provided by the charity has grown over years and apart from its spiritual activities, it now also provides daily, weekly and monthly activities, and includes activities around music, culture, dance, health and well-being, bereavement support, and a day centre with luncheon facilities, to name but a few.

As a charity we normally rely on income from events and generous donations from our community to help us care for the building, provide regular events and support our community – but this income has fallen drastically due to Covid-19. Prof. Ram Panjwani (1911-1987) Cultural ambassador of Sindhi community

Prof. Ram Panjwani was a renowned singer in the Sindhi folk tradition, an eminent writer who authored 25 books, and educationist who retired as a Professor of Sindhi in Jai Hind College Mumbai. He received numerous awards and honours, and was the first Sindhi to be conferred the Padma Shree. He is credited with giving us the slogan "Jeko Chavando Jhulelal - Tahinja Thinda Bera Par".

Kumari Jethi Tulsidas Sipahimalani (1906-1978) Freedom fighter, legislator and social reformer

Kumari Jethi Sipahimalani played important roles in the Indian independence movement. She was elected twice to the Sindh Legislative Assembly and in 1937, and became its first woman Deputy Speaker. Following partition in 1947, she played a significant role in rehabilitating Sindhi refugees in India. She setup a number of housing complexes in Bombay Presidency, housing thousands of Sindhis stranded in the military barracks.

Popati Hiranandani (1924-2005) Sindhi writer and educator

Popati Hiranandani was an inspiring Sindhi feminist, activist, writer, poet, and educator. She authored more than sixty books, written in Sindhi, and made significant contributions to Sindhi literature before and after the partition of India. She graduated with a distinction in Sanskrit from Banaras Hindu University in 1943. Amongst her numerous awards were the Sahitya Akademi Award (1982), Woman of the Year Award (1988), and the Gaurav Puraskar (1990).

Dada Ram Bulchand Jethmalani (1923-2019) India's finest criminal lawyer

Dada Jethmalani was a legal legend. He fought his first case at the age of 17 in the court of Sindh. He is remembered for his fearless, timeless and unfading contributions in the making of legal jurisprudence in India. As one of the finest legal minds in India, he used his extraordinary talents to uphold human rights, crusade for justice, and tirelessly campaign against corruption in high places. He also fought most of his cases on a pro-bono basis (nominal or no fee).

Dr Lakhumal Hiranand Hiranandani (1917 - 2013) An otorhinolaryngologist, social activist and philanthropist

Dr Hiranandani was an otorhinolaryngologist with a strong social conscience. He pioneered surgical techniques which later came to be published in "Dr. Hiranandani's Operations". He was a recipient of a Golden Award of the American Academy of Otolaryngology, the first Indian to receive the honour. The Government of India awarded him the third highest civilian honour of the Padma Bhushan, in 1972, for his contributions to medicine and society.

Dada Chellaram (1904 - 1964) **Scholar, public servant and spiritual master**

Dada Chellaram was a qualified lawyer, who after the partition of India served in the Ministry of Defence in New Delhi. He was an accomplished scholar with a formidable command of Sikh scripture. True to long-standing Sindhi tradition, he took inspiration teachings enshrined in Shri Guru Granth Sahib, and inspired others through kirtan. In 1958, he established Nirgun Balak Satsang Mandal, and a series of religious centres. He was the spiritual guide of Dada Iswhar Balani, the founder of Holy Mission of Guru Nanak.

Shah Abdul Latif Bhittai (1689–1752) Mystic Sindhi sufi poet

Shah Abdul Latif is widely considered to be the greatest Sindhi poet. His collected poems were assembled in the compilation *Shah Jo Risalo* After he passed away, a mausoleum was built over his grave and this became a popular pilgrimage site for those inspired by him and is considered to be one of the most important place in Sindh.

Sucheta Kripalani (1908 - 1974) First woman chief minister of free India

Sucheta Kripalani was a fearless freedom fighter during the Indian independence struggle. She then became one of the first few women parliamentarians in independent India. Her political roles included membership of the UP Provincial Parliament (1950-52), two successive Lok Sabhas (1952-56, 1957-62), and Minister of Labour, Community Development and Industry (1960-1963). In 1963 she became Chief Minister of the state - the first female Chief Minister of an Indian State.

Bhagwanti Navani (1940 - 1986) **Sindhi actress and singer**

Bhagwanti Navani was a highly accomplished singer and and actress. Often called the "Sindhi Koel" due to her melodious and sweet voice, Bhagwanti Navani was known for her work in Sindhi-language music and films. She acted in many Sindh plays and famously appeared as the lead actress in the Sindhi film "Sindhu-a-Je Kinare". She is most remembered for her singing of "Sukhmani Sahib" in Sindhi which is still part of daily life of many Sindhi homes.
